- 1. Rounding: checking in on patients to assist with requested tasks.
- Observe advanced procedures
- 3. Communication with staff
- 4. Communication with patients / family
- 5. Stock patient rooms / blood draw trays
- 6. Make unoccupied
- 7. Make occupied beds
- Set up and assist with complete bed baths
- 9. Perform oral care
- Set up trays for breakfast or lunch
- 11. Feed patients
- Record patient intake and output

- 13. Assist with patient positioning
- 14. Ambulate patients
- 15. Assist patients with bed pans, briefs, foley care
- 16. Perform vital signs
- 17. Recognize and report abnormal vital signs
- 18. Discharge patients
- 19. Assist with postmortem care
- 20. Bladder scans
- 21. Specimen collection
- Perform EKG'S and Telemetry
- 23. Assist with blood draws
- 24. Any other duties assigned by staff





















